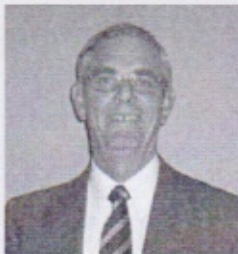

MESSAGE FROM THE COLONEL OF THE REGIMENT

Congratulations again for the production of the Association Newsletter. This is an extremely important element of the communications amongst Branches to keep members informed of Association events and activities.

Let me first of all congratulate the Association for the very successful and productive Annual General Meeting held in Wainwright this past May. The meeting and related events were very well organized and it was a real pleasure to renew so many acquaintances during the weekend.

A great deal of work has continued in the planning of our 100th Anniversary. The Consolidated Guidance was issued in August to provide those who planning various activities and events with the necessary direction and guidance. This was designed to ensure a unified approach to our planning and to assist in maintaining the overall aim of the 100th Anniversary – to celebrate with the nation the 100th Anniversary of the PPCLI. The final regimental plan will be issued this fall and will be a one-source document containing the necessary details on all activities associated with the 100th Anniversary.

On August 22, BGen King (President of the Regimental Guard) and I met with the Army Commander to discuss our 100th and to seek army support. LGen Devlin was very pleased with the scope and extent of planning and pledged to support the Regiment in its endeavors to celebrate our 100 years of service with the nation.

In addition, much progress has been made on identifying the costs and revenue to support our 100th. This will become part of the plan once approved by the Regimental Executive Committee, Regimental Guard and Association. The Association has been very actively pursuing the plans for the memorials, the commemorations and other responsibilities that have been taken on by the Association. Fundraising has begun in earnest.

The Association will play a very significant role in meeting the aim of the 100th Anniversary, and the efforts to date leave no doubt that they are fulfilling this role with a great deal of enthusiasm and interest. I would encourage all members of the Association to continue to support these efforts and to contribute where you can as we move out of the planning and into the execution phase of our 100th Anniversary.

I look forward to seeing many of you over the next few months, and to attending the Association AGM in Calgary 24-27 May next year.

**MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE ASSOCIATION**

My first task in this Newsletter, on behalf of all members of the Association, is to thank our Past-President, Bert Scott, for his leadership and stewardship of the Association for the past four years. Bert you may have moved to New Brunswick, but you remain an important member of Council and I look forward to your continued insights. You can't escape!

This is my second attempt at communicating with the wider membership. I took a leap into the modern age a couple of months ago and distributed a video message. I hope that most of you had the opportunity to see it. It is still posted on the website if you missed it.

Since the AGM when I was elected as your National President I have been communicating with your executive on a regular basis by email and through the medium of monthly teleconferences. I have also been passing information to the Members of the Association Council on a fairly regular basis by way of sending "Notes to Council". I trust that your Branch Council Members, normally your Branch Presidents, have been passing the relevant information from these notes on to you. If they haven't, you may want to ask them, "Why Not?"

Our new website is up and running and we are making a concerted effort to get all members access to it. This is where most of you will get your information from. When you do get on to it, please let us know what you like and what you don't like about it so that we can make the necessary changes.



.....MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

At the Council Working Group that we held in Wainwright, Council began a Strategic Review. Essentially this was the beginning of a discussion on where you, the members, believe the Association should be 10 years from now. This is a three-step process: realistically defining who we are today; defining where we want to be 10 years from now; then making a plan to get there. We only scratched the surface of this issue at the Council Working Group, so I have asked the Branch Presidents to carry on this discussion with you at the Branches and to provide feedback to me by the end of March 2012. You can also expect to see questionnaires and surveys on this issue on the website in the coming months. Please take the opportunity to provide your input.

The vast majority of the Association's work is accomplished by the various Council Committees, (Public Policy and Communications, Membership, Finance and Audit, By-laws and Fund Raising). All too often in the past these committees have been committees of one person. Frankly, that's not good enough because it limits ideas and the capacity to implement them. I am making a concerted effort to revitalize our committee structure to make it work more effectively. Normally committee membership and chairmanship is drawn from members of Council; however, all participation is welcome. If you have an interest in being a member of any one of these committees let your Branch President know or feel free to contact me directly.

You are well aware that the Regiment's 100th Anniversary is fast approaching. A Final Draft of the Regimental Plan has been distributed and made available on the website. The plan will be finalized in October and the final version will be posted when available.

We, the Association have committed to raising \$250,000 for the 100th, primarily to fund the four projects that we have agreed to undertake: the Frezenberg Memorial; Hamilton Gault Memorial Park, the Ottawa Memorials and the Centennial Baton. All of these projects are progressing, but we will soon be reaching the point that we will need to expend significant amounts of money to move them towards completion. I understand that \$250,000 is a lot of money. Let me make it a bit more personal for you. The challenge for each member of the Association is to raise \$312.50 between now and the end of 2013. Don't get me wrong! I am **not** asking you to put your hand in your own pocket. I **am** asking you to be creative in developing and energetic in delivering successful fund raising initiatives and events, primarily at the Branch level, to help raise the required funds.

Let me wrap up by saying that I am looking forward to serving the membership over the next couple of years. It isn't my Association, it's yours. The Association's continued success and future direction are dependant upon your input and effort.



PPCLI FOUNDATION OVERVIEW

On the 27th of August, the Foundation celebrated its first birthday - what an exciting and action-packed year it has been. I am extremely proud of the outstanding team that has been assembled to do just that: to serve a great Regiment and its people - from the newest joined to the oldest of our dwindling contingent of World War II veterans and all those in between, including their families and those of our fallen.

The Foundation has two mandates: to raise funds to support the Regiment and its veterans and families and to raise funds for the support of the 100th Anniversary commemoration planned for 2014-2015. Our **First in the Field** fundraising campaign will run until 11 November, 2018, the 100th Anniversary of the armistice in World War I. Our fundraising activity for our sustainable program of support will be off to the races this fall and winter.

The Foundation is mindful of the pressures we all face with the demands we are under to contribute to many charities. We intend that your donations will be used to support the greatest needs among our veterans and families and to support those organizations that serve our veterans. An Introduction to the Webmaster

Joined in 1976 as an infantryman. CFR'd in 1979 to infantry officer on completion of two degrees, and selected to serve with the PPCLI. While an infantry officer I had two different postings to 1PPCLI, including deployment to Cyprus 1984, and

one posting to 2Cdo. Reclassified to intelligence officer in 1989. Posted back to the CAR as the G2. Completed CLCSC and Joint Intelligence Course (UK). Posted to 1CMBG as the G2 and CO 1 Int Pl. Completed Interrogation Course, becoming Chief Interrogator for 1 CMBG. Posted to UK Army, serving with BH Command HQ as the G2 Ops in Sarajevo for 13 months. Posted to the UN serving with UNPF HQ in Zagreb. On repatriation to Canada posted to NDHQ, National Defence Intelligence Centre as DCO of the Yugo Crisis Cell. Later assigned as the CO of the National Collection and Intelligence Requirements Management Centre (CCIRM), J2 Plans. Final posting was back to the Army as the DLFR 4-2, LF Intelligence Planning, where I also served as the CF Chief Interrogator. Medically released, in the rank of major, due to physical wounds and Chronic PTSD after 26 years of service. Began terminal leave in 2000.

Since retirement, I started Hyland Motorshop Inc., <http://HylandMotorshop.com>, which focuses on rebuilds of classic and antique motorbikes.

I have also served as the First National VP of The Canadian Army Veteran Motorcycle Units (CAV), <http://TheCAV.ca>, as well as the Founder and First President of 3rd CAV, a subordinate formation, and the Founder and First President of the CAV unit (chapter) Ypres Unit, located in Calgary. I remain with The CAV to this day as one of the Originals and a Skirmisher.

I also founded VeteranVoice.info (VVi), <http://VeteranVoice.info>, 10 years ago, which serves as the largest Canadian site for the distribution and databasing of veteran related info and news. I remain as the organization's publisher while having delegated editorial and web mastering duties to a full, volunteer, dedicated staff.

This event features the country group *Whiskey Jane* and their tribute song '*Dear Jane*'. The proceeds from this event will go to support the work of the MFRC and the Veterans Care Cell at Regimental HQ.

During the Grey Cup Game in Vancouver on 24 - 27 November we will be co-hosting the **Canadian House of Heroes** in Partnership with the CFL Alumni Association (for details go to www.canadianhouseofheroes.com). In February and March 2012, we will be supporting a six - game gala dinner and hockey challenge matches between teams from the infantry regiments and the NHL Old-timers in partnership with the Amputees' Coalition of Canada (for details check out www.heroeshockeychallenge.com).

Great ideas can come from anywhere. Often, the greatest ideas come from the most unlikely places. On these pages you have read of some of our plans. I hope that they inspire you as much as they do me and the team here at the Foundation. If they do inspire you and you have other ideas, please don't be shy about breaking down our doors. The Hamilton Gault Memorial Fund (HGMF) is the principal financial organization for the charitable operations of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI) Association, committed to devote all of its resources to charitable purposes and activities. The Hamilton Gault Memorial Fund operates primarily as an endowment with accrued interest being disbursed annually to:

Support the PPCLI Regimental Museum and Archives;

1. Offer bursaries for serving and former members of the PPCLI, their families and the members of Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps that are affiliated with the PPCLI;
2. Provide financial support to Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps that are affiliated with the PPCLI;
3. Provide referrals and facilitate access to appropriate social, medical and legal agencies for serving and former members of the PPCLI and their families suffering hardship; and
4. Develop and maintain various PPCLI Regimental memorials.

Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry (PPCLI) is one of Canada's most famous infantry regiments. On August 3rd 1914, Hamilton Gault of Montreal offered to Canada to raise and equip a battalion for overseas service. On 6th August the Government accepted the offer, and the daughter of the Governor General of the time, Princess Patricia, agreed to lend her name to this about-to-form group of men largely of previous service. The charter of the regiment was signed on 10th August and recruiting began rapidly, being finished in eight days at Ottawa. Thus began a proud and splendid story of service to Canada. The PPCLI quickly established a reputation for ground-breaking leadership, service and sacrifice. The PPCLI distinguished itself in both World Wars, Korea, Afghanistan and on numerous operations in support of the United Nations and NATO.

The Regiment will commemorate 100 years of service to Canada in 2014. This centennial commemoration will be marked by a triad of events: a National Commemoration at the Regiment's current Home Station in Edmonton; an Ottawa Commemoration in the Nation's capital; and a return to Frezenberg in May 2015 where the Regiment, fighting as part of the British 27th Division during the great and costly battle of Belleward Ridge, distinguished itself by holding the line, but with the loss of many of the "Originals".

Each commemoration activity will have a memorial element to it. Hamilton Gault Memorial Park at Garrison Edmonton is being expanded with additional elements being added to the park. In Ottawa, the Regimental cairn in Landsdowne Park will be relocated to a more suitable location with the addition of a bas relief depicting the presentation of the original camp flag by Princess Patricia. The Regimental Memorial at Frezenberg will be updated to reflect the Regiment's marking the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of Frezenberg. A Centennial Baton will be created to link these commemorations. The Centennial Baton will be run by relay from Edmonton to Ottawa and also play an important role in the commemoration at Frezenberg.

Canada Revenue Agency has granted the Hamilton Gault Memorial Fund authority to accrue funds through to 2014 to be expended on these memorial projects.

2. Please note that all decisions on the use or non-use of submitted material will be the sole domain of the production team.
3. Included with **each** photo or item should be a single card or piece of paper, with the background including the month and year of the photo, the names and ranks of the persons in the picture, unless unknown (unknown), or if estimated (?), and an explanation of what the picture is about - its context. Please also clearly identify who owns the photo or material, with an e-mail address if available, and a phone number on each card/paper with each photo/item.
4. All material needs to reach the Regimental Museum by 31 January 2012. All material will be considered a gift from the provider to the PPCLI Museum and Archives, and may be used without recompense or any copyright issue. If the provider wants the material back, he/she must ask for its return with an annotation "Please return" on the accompanying card/paper. Material that is asked to be returned should be returned to the provider by December 2012.

If there is a composition selected, it will become a march of PPCLI, while it would continue to be the property of the composer/writer(s). Other submissions will be returned if accompanied by an addressed, return postage paid envelope. Selection will be complete by 1 April 2012 and the winner will be notified by post.

If a winner is selected, PPCLI would then move to have the selected composition recorded and released in a CD format. The winning composer/writer(s) would receive a single gratuity of \$100.00, would be announced as the winner in various regimental media, and would receive six copies of the intended recording when it is produced.
