Born Princess Patricia of Connaught and a granddaughter of Queen Victoria we are proud that she gave her name to our Regiment and we perpetuate it with pride. Her presentation of a Camp Colour (later called the Ric-A-Dam-Doo) to the Regiment before departure to World War 1 and her simple, natural manners, and lack of stiff etiquette certainly endeared her to our soldiers. Such was her pride and continued interest in the Regiment that she was appointed our first Colonel-in-Chief in 1918 and retained it until her death in 1974. Indeed, her dedication, faith, pride in the Regiment and humility, are all characteristics we should each endeavor to emulate to this day.
